
The late Venerable M. M. Mahaweera Mahāthera

Founder of Mangala Vihara (Buddhist Temple) Founder of Buddhist and Pali College of Singapore

"When the Japanese occupied Singapore during the Second World War in the early 1940s, many Sri Lankan have already left Singapore. Bhante stayed on to administer religious services to those left behind with a Burmese monk, Ven. U. Wandiya."

"Although Bhante had read the teaching of the Buddha from the Suttas and being blessed with great powers of recall, he had sometimes regretted that he did not have the opportunity for higher education earlier in his life. Therefore, Bhante wanted to educate many in the teachings of the Buddha, he started the Sunday Dhamma School in the late 1930s."

As the Founding Principal, Bhante worked closely with Buddhist and Pali University of Sri Lanka to structure and review the syllabi of the tertiary education in Buddhist Studies leading to the award of Diploma, B.A., M.A. and PhD. He was attentive to the faculty staff's and students' needs and development, and skilfully groomed students to become teachers. Under his astute leadership, BPC Singapore has produced more than a thousand Diploma holders, graduates and postgraduates.

Bhante was an erudite monk in numerous fields of studies, especially in Buddhist studies. He was a knowledgeable lecturer and a research scholar in Buddhist philosophy (both Theravada and Mahayana), social philosophy, philosophy of religion, Pāli and Sanskrit. He wrote many books and papers, not previously written by others, as reference materials for students locally and internationally.

In Aṅguttara Nikāya - Ānanda Sutta, Venerable Ānanda and Venerable Sāriputta discussed how a spiritual seeker could further his learning and understanding. Venerable Ānanda, foremost in comprehensive learning, mentioned six qualities:

- 1. Master the Dhamma;
- 2. Teach the Dhamma in detail;
- 3. Get others to recite the Dhamma;
- 4. Hold group chanting to repeat the recitation;
- 5. Reflect, ponder and examine the Dhamma and
- 6. During the rain retreats, approach learned senior monks from time to time to raise questions and seek clarifications on doubtful areas."



The Bodhi sapling was brought here by the great **Bhikkhuni Sanghamitta**, who travelled from India by sea. It was planted ceremonially by after a grand procession. The whole country rejoiced.





Bhikkhuni Sanghamitta stayed on in Sri Lanka and established the order of the nuns. She taught people the path to peace. She worked with tireless devotion and undaunted courage for the moral, intellectual and spiritual uplift of the womenfolk of this country till her final days. I truly respect her.
