
On 7 June 2025, the *Mahāsaṅgha* and lay community gathered at Mangala Vihara to commemorate Memorial Day, in honour of:

On 17 June 2025, the Buddhist and Pali University (BPU), Sri Lanka, hosted a Memorial Scholarship Award Ceremony in remembrance of both the late founder and founding principal of the Buddhist and Pali College of Singapore (BPC), whose vision and dedication left an enduring legacy in the field of Buddhist education in Singapore.



Significance:

Waso Robe Offering Ceremony

13 July 2025

Many would have heard of *Kaṭhina* Robe Offering, which happens at the end of a rainy retreat (*vassa*). **Waso Robe Offering**, on the other hand, is offered at the start of the *vassa*¹, according to the Myanmar tradition. In MV, the Waso Robe Offering Ceremony was held on 13 July 2025. Students from the General Arts Qualifying (GAQ) class and other BPC members were invited to join MV's Myanmar community to attend the ceremony.



Practice in Myanmar

- Before the retreat begins (around Waso Full Moon Day), devotees gather at monasteries to discuss and prepare for the event.
- They offer new robes (Waso-thingan) and other requisites such as medicine, alms food and monastery utilities.
- This offering is often done by families, communities, or even at the national level with the government organizing state robe offerings.

Significance

Similar to *Kaṭhina* Robe Offering, Waso Robe Offering is considered a great merit (*puñña-kamma*) because it is one of the four requisites for the *Saṅgha* monastics. It also supports their observance of the *Vassa* and strengthens the connection between the *Saṅgha* monastics and lay community.

¹ In Myanmar, the Buddhist rainy retreat (*Vassa*) is called Waso because it begins in the Myanmar month of Waso (around July).

Cultural Aspects in Myanmar

Many villages and towns organize Waso-thingan pwe (robe-offering ceremonies). Young men and women also carry Waso alms-bowls (thingan hnget pwe) to collect donations for robes, reflecting the participation of the community. It is thus seen as both a religious duty and a cultural festival in Myanmar Buddhist life.



In Myanmar, Waso (ဝါဆို) marks the beginning of the Vassa (Rainy Retreat, ဝါဆို). It is usually in the month of June to July.

One important tradition connected with this is the Waso robe offering (Waso-thingan pwe, ဝါဆိုသင်္ကန်းပွဲ), including offering of other requisites, to the monastics at the start of Vassa.
